Sid Miller is a Well-Traveled Man

Texas Agriculture Commissioner Sid Miller is in hot water again.

Earlier this year, Miller faced legal problems arising from two out-of-state trips. One was to Mississippi to compete in a rodeo in April, a trip he paid for with state and campaign funds. The Commissioner said he intended to meet with Mississippi State officials during the trip but said when he got there, "no one was home," even though he knocked several times. Miller strangles baby cows competitively.

The Commissioner also took a trip to Oklahoma on the State's dime to get a treatment for his back, a vitamin mixture called the "Jesus Shot," leading many to wonder why a medicine with that name failed to make Miller a better person. Again, the Commissioner said he meant to meet with Oklahoma state officials while he was there but when he called, all he got was their voice mail.

In the most recent case, Miller traveled to Amsterdam for more medical treatment, this time for a dose of "Jesus Weed." Like the previous trips, the Commissioner charged Texas taxpayers for his travel expenses and claimed he was supposed to meet with Martijn van Dam, the Netherlands' Undersecretary of Agriculture.

"I was supposed to meet with Marty, or whatever his name is, but when I got there, my phone was out of charge," Miller said. Education Board Nixes Textbook

The Texas State Board of Education recently put the kibosh on a textbook about Mexican-Americans that was accused of being racist and riddled with inaccuracies.

After a long public meeting, which witnessed numerous Hispanic leaders and academics decrying the book, the board voted 14-0 to not adopt the text.

Momentum Instruction defended the textbook, saying that it "bent over backwards" to appease the book's critics. As an example, the company noted that it had changed the book's title to "Mexican American Heritage" from "Big Old Lazy Mexicans."

"I mean, we had to make a new cover and everything," complained Momentum CEO Cynthia Dunbar. Dunbar denies the book is racist and claims her company's constitutional rights are being violated, which prompted one member of the board to tell Dunbar to "shut the hell up."

Among the many disputed issues in the book are passages that accuse Mexican Americans of "cannibalism," being similar in appearance to "Chinamen," speaking another language "so they can talk bad about white people," and have natural talents for "gardening and housecleaning."

"I can't believe anyone could accuse me of racism," Dunbar said. "My gardener and maid are Mexicans, and they will be happy to tell you how much they love me. They even nicknamed me 'Tia Puta.' I mean, isn't that sweet?"

Other controversial social studies texts published by Momentum Instruction include: "It Was the Black Guy: The History of Crime in the United States;" "Rucky Us: Asians in the West;" "Oy Vay! What's with All These Jews?" and the children's book, "Whitey Makes Things Right."

A half-million dollars is made up of 50 million pennies. That is so many pennies that, if you lined them up, they would make a chain from Earth to Pluto and back.

Okay, that was a lie. But the truth is \$500,000 is a lot of money, especially if it is being used for the power of good.

After a mere 10 years, Billy's Ice House is on verge of having helped raise \$500,000 for numerous charities and causes. The effort is not an anomaly for Billy's Ice, but is embedded into its very core.

Nick Sisoian, current owner and general manager of Billy's Ice, said helping others helps define what Billy's is about. In fact, the ice house holds fundraisers "about every month."

"We love hosting fundraising events and we take it very seriously," he said. "We will do it for local charities, local families and as a reaction to serious events, such as floods or fires. We will also do work for those who want to raise awareness for certain groups, such as Special Olympics of Texas, Red Cross. There are also memorial events, such as for members of the local music community whose families want to raise money for scholarship funds, memorials, research and such."

Nick, along with his family, also owns Red River Ice House, which has helped raise another \$500,000 for local charities. This means, of course, that both businesses have pulled together an astounding \$1 million for local causes.

The owner lays all of the credit for New Braunfels.

"The New Braunfels community is phenomenal – they are incredibly generous

and supportive," Nick said. "From the smallest donation to the biggest check, we want everyone to know that we truly appreciate every dollar. And they can be secure in knowing that 100 percent is going to the cause they are giving to.

"At these events, you can donate any amount you want, whether it's a dollar or a hundred dollars," he said. "This, we feel, is the most honest way we can say we have reached \$500,000, all from voluntary donations, from locals who donated their own money to help others in their community."

Nick takes great pride in the staff at Billy's Ice, who goes above and beyond to help any worthy cause. Many times, it's the staff who bring those in need of help to his attention.

"Whatever the case, if something happens, we want people to know they can call us," the owner said. "We'll make the facility available, we'll put the staff on it, and we'll promote and raise awareness for the cause. Also, we don't like to charge a cover for such events. If you come, you don't have to give anything, but someone will be at the door to promote the cause, to say 'this is why we're here today, will you please donate?'"

The annual Turkey Fry is a perfect example, which Billy's Ice has been organizing for a decade. In fact, the event was held on the Ice House's very first night of operation in 2006. At last month's Turkey Fry, Billy's Ice was able to raise 1,000 pounds of food and \$1,000 (which Nick says can buy this fundraising success on the residents of another five tons of food). All of the proceeds went to local food banks.

One of the reasons for their success is that their efforts are geared toward local people helping neighbors, family and friends.

"This money comes from hard-working locals who care about supporting others in need," Nick said. "In a close community like this, we always know of somebody out there who is having a hard time. We often run into families that suddenly will have a cancer patient in the family, from the very young to the very old."

The next big event for Billy's Ice will be the second annual Coats & Cash for Kids. The goal of the fundraiser is to collect winter clothing for local children's charities as well as to raise funds for SOAR (Society for Orphaned Armenian Relief). SOAR supports orphanages and schools for children of refugees, as well as orphaned children with special needs. Nick is still working on a firm date, but look for the event later this month or early January.

Nick feels the best way he can benefit his community is not just with his monetary donations, but to be there for people.

"For us to say we have the resources that we can put to the best use has always been critical to our business model and attitude," he said. "If we're going to be a busy place, then we need to be busy for the public and the community events, as well. All of our staff takes great pride in this."




