

DA Jennifer Tharp: "Tough on Crime" -Weak on Criminals

We already knew that DA
Jennifer Tharp and Chief Felony
Prosecutor Sammy McCrary were
prone to draconian punishment and/

or legal harassment of minor suspects with weak cases against them and apt to let the big offenders off with little more than a scolding, but due to some reckless jabberin' to Texas Monthly, now know that they think conservatives are stupid, cruel, and lacking both a moral compass and everyday sense of justice. We're probably more surprised than we should be.

Backstory

In December of 2014, dude-bro Cameron Wright was drinking and smoking the reefer with Aliah Hernandez, and they was getting' BUSY. Before things got naked, Hernandez informed Wright that she was transgender – that is, not born female. So Wright got mad because he's no homo and stormed out of their hotel room to sulk.

Wait, that's not right.

Wright did eventually leave their hotel room, sure, but first he gave her a vicious head-butt, told her "You're going to die tonight", beat her within an inch of her life with whatever was handy furniture-wise, partially ripped her ear off, crushed her throat to the point she had trouble breathing and left her, unconscious, in a pool of blood on the floor of a destroyed hotel room, and chucked her cell-phone so she couldn't call for help.

Then he left the room.

Eventually Hernandez came to, and was able to drag herself to the lobby where, bloodied/bruised/swollen and with the cartilage of her left ear hanging from her head, she awaited police. She could barely get any words out of her mangled throat. She was airlifted to BAMC where doctors took two days to put her back together, at a cost of \$22,000.

When police finally figured out who

dude-bro was, they asked him to come in for a voluntary interview regarding the case, where he admitted to everything (except Hernandez's loss of consciousness), because hey, what guy wouldn't want to kill a tranny if he'd thought he was about

to get some natural-born ya-ya only to not get it? I mean, is there anything **worse** that could happen to a dude-bro?

Anyway, Wright was charged with felony assault, and Hernandez was told by police that he was headed for prison. Except not.

Grand Jury Shenanigans

In order for a DA to file felony charges for anything, they have to obtain an indictment from the local grand jury. Getting an indictment is the easiest thing in the world - prosecutors give only the state's side of the story - no defense arguments, no mitigating factors are presented. The standard of proof is as low as it gets prosecutors don't have to prove anything, only provide evidence that a crime was committed; and in this case it was clear that Hernandez didn't beat herself up. The state's argument could have been as straightforward as "Wright beat up Hernandez so bad that Hernandez had to be airlifted because local hospitals couldn't handle the massive injuries. Here's a photo of the scene. Here's Wright's confession."

Slam dunk.

Actually, no. According to DA Tharp, she couldn't get an indictment after taking two shots at it (the first by an assistant prosecutor, the second by Tharp herself). Which is odd. Really odd. Almost every indictment sought in Comal County is granted.

(Note: Two weeks after Tharp told Texas Monthly about the two attempts to indict, she refused to confirm that she went to the grand jury at all.)

So the question must be asked: WTF did she tell the grand jury that would cause them to refuse to indict? We'll never know, because nobody's allowed to talk about what goes on in the grand jury, but we can say this with absolute certainty – if Mama didn't get no indictment, it's 'cause Mama didn't want no indictment.

We can be sure of this because Tharp wasn't out of options after the grand jury. She could have charged Wright with Class A (or B, or C) misdemeanor assault without an indictment. But she didn't. She didn't charge him with assault at all.

The Upshot: Because you can beat up a "tranny" on Jennifer Tharp's watch, and I don't mean smack her up, I mean **really** beat up a tranny, leave her for dead, and get away without charges being pressed, the DA has just put a bright pink target on every single transgender person in Comal County. It's open ####ing season, folks. Take your pick.

Should you avail yourself of this opportunity, your defense should go something like: "I asked this chick out and before we had sex she told me she was really a dude so I tried to kill her because dude-bro." We have it on the record that that will work. We have it on the record from Sammy McCrary, who, in his time machine from 1955, said that the office would have prosecuted had Hernandez told Wright that she was trans before they got to the hotel room. See? Makes all the difference. She didn't do everything just so. Didn't check every box. She had it coming.

Neither Tharp nor McCrary wanted to prosecute. But why TF not? Well, according to what McCrary told Texas Monthly, it was because Hernandez was a "nontraditional victim", and "We typically get conservative jurors here. This county is known for that." (McCrary might have just set himself up for a federal civil rights case with those statements. Hard to say because "nontraditional" victims shouldn't have human rights, let alone civil rights. We'll keep you posted.)

As noted at the top of this piece, we now know what McCreary thinks of conservatives: Stupid. Cold. Unable to understand justice. Lacking basic human empathy. And dumb enough to let somebody as dangerous as Wright clean off the hook.

Real nice, Sammy. I'm sure the locals appreciate your assessment. For the record, you have to go way past "conservative" to get to the MSNBC definition you're peddling. We'll make sure Republicans remember that come the next DA election. We bet there's more than a handful that would've voted otherwise in May had they known this was going down.

Say, if you're a conservative that's eligible to serve on a Comal County jury, this might be a good time to let Sammy know what you think of his opinion of your ethics. 830-221-1300.

Good lord, even if an afterthought, the most hateful, anti-trans comments left about this case on the KSAT and WOAI message boards included the words "he needs to be punished" somewhere in the text. No, wait. <sarcasm>That's Bexar County where the conservatives are way more sophisticated. </sarcasm>

Look, Sammy, we don't need you to win every case, but we sure AF need you to file charges of some kind to show where you stand on issues of ultra-violence. This is an epic moral fail. Whatever your qualifications, whatever the election results were, justice is a matter of ethics and you and DA Tharp have proven yourselves not morally fit for this gig. You took an oath to serve justice, not to rack up easy wins. You've betrayed one in favor of the other, to everyone's detriment.

Ok, ok. We're getting worked up, here. In all fairness, Tharp didn't just let Wright walk. It would be wrong for us to act like he got away with it.

Jennifer got him on throwing away Hernadez's phone. Got him GOOD. Fifteen days in jail and 18 months probation. TWO solid weeks behind bars. That'll teach him. And let that be a lesson to you as well – the next time you beat up a trans-woman in Comal County, let her keep her phone.

FREILIFI DISPUSSION WITH BRANT FREEMAN

Time for another Month In Review and thankfully the past month has given us a lot to watch and discuss, including the NBA Finals and the World Cup and who would've thought I would enjoy the latter more than the former? The NBA Finals, outside of J.R. Smith's hilarious late game screw-up in Game One was hot garbage while the World Cup has been wildly entertaining. I'm not a huge soccer-aficionado but I will absolutely ignore all distractions (including my family) to watch matches like Argentina vs France. I bet I could even name four players so I'm certain that makes me a qualified soccer expert.

While I'm sure you would enjoy reading my 5,000 word take on how badly Spain played against Russia in the Round of 16, this month I'm focusing on the NBA off-season and the (rare) drama circulating around the San Antonio Spurs.

One of the tricky things about writing a column for a monthly publication is the timing of it. I'm punching away at the keyboard on July 1, a mere 12 hours after the start of the NBA free agent frenzy so by the time you're reading this, a lot may have changed. Maybe LeBron James is a Laker or a Sixer or still a Cavalier. Maybe Kawhi Leonard is his teammate or perhaps he's still a Spur. I assume those possibilities will come to a conclusion within the first week of July so you'll have to pardon any speculation on my part because as of this writing, we don't have those answers. Also, if I'm completely off base, you have every right to mock me later. Those are the rules.

Let's focus on Leonard about whom I've written in this space many, many times, especially in the last six months. During the Spurs' season and even shortly after it ended with a first round loss to Golden State, I, naively, thought that everything would work out and whatever issues that arose between Leonard and the Spurs would simply get sorted out and that San Antonio would gladly offer him the coveted "super-max" contract which he would sign and everyone would live happily ever after. After all, Tim Duncan decided to stay despite being awfully tempted to join

Tracy McGrady and Grant Hill in Orlando in the summer of 2000 (so bizarre to think of this today, but the Magic used to be an attractive franchise to play for). David Robinson spent his entire career as a Spur. Manu Ginobili and Tony Parker (probably) will have done the same. Franchise cornerstones arrive in San Antonio and don't leave. That's just how it's always worked.

But those days appear to be over, at least in the case of Kawhi Leonard. A month ago, I was 90% sure he was coming back. Today I'm 99% sure he will be traded. Once that inevitably happens, I can't help but wonder how we got here. The marriage between the NBA's most ho-hum yet consistently successful franchise and "don't put the spotlight on me" superstar seemed perfect. San Antonio had that with Robinson who passed the torch to Duncan who then passed it to Leonard. Another generational talent who would keep finding ways to put banners in the rafters until it was time to pass the torch to next future Hall-of-Famer wearing nothing but silver and black.

And that's where we as fans were wrong. We all thought that because Leonard is quiet he MUST be the next Tim Duncan. He MUST love playing for a franchise which shies away from the headlines. He MUST love the way the Spurs operate as an organization.

Is this all because he doesn't talk? Maybe because he's so quiet, we simply don't know who Kawhi Leonard is. Once the news broke of Leonard's desire to be traded, Spurs fans turned on him instantly. The tired act of burning his jersey. Calling him a coward. A traitor.

Just like we were quick to pass judgement when Leonard was saying three words at a time after dropping 36 points in a playoff game (he's such a lovable robot!), I think fans are reacting far too hastily with Leonard propping one foot out the door.

Could this have been handled better by him or "his people"? Sure. If this once happy marriage does ultimately end in divorce, it will have been ugly. But ultimately, Leonard is just looking to get what we all attain for: happiness. Maybe, and as hard as this is to believe for

people who live in South Texas, including myself, he doesn't like it here (or at least not as much as Southern California). Maybe he didn't like the constant Duncan comparisons or the way the franchise operates. Your first response might be "how could he not?!?" but you're not Kawhi Leonard.

Bottom line: yeah, this sucks. The Spurs have avoided a full-on rebuild for more than 30 years (!) and finally now might find themselves in that situation depending on what they get back in a Leonard trade. But you can't fault Leonard for ultimately wanting to "go back home" and find happiness although you can definitely find fault in the way he made that happen.

An educated guess tells me that Leonard has had a desire to go elsewhere for a while now but did in fact have a serious quad injury and didn't want to risk losing out on a sizeable contract with his next team (preferably one of the two teams in Los Angeles). Leonard then became overly cautious of the injury, to the point where it irritated the Spurs who had medically cleared him to play and they reacted like anyone else would: frustrated. Those frustrations were then vented both publicly and behind closed doors so here we are now, with a mess of a situation which only has one plausible solution: a parting of ways.

Again, I must stress that the last paragraph is purely speculation on my part, who knows what we'll learn once the Spurs officially pull the trigger on a trade.

It's funny, this time last year, Public Enemy Number One in San Antonio was Golden State's Zaza Pachulia whose carless play led to Leonard's injury midway through Game 1 of the Western Conference Finals, causing Leonard to miss the rest of the series.

Who would've of thought that a year later, the question concerning Leonard will have turned from "what if?" to "what now?"

Will Someone Just Secede Already?

It doesn't even matter to me where whomever or whatever secedes to, or if they form another country or state or borough. Criminy, I'm not even sure what a borough is other than they have them in New York City. What matters is that we need to break up, take some time to figure out what it is we want and what it is we can do on our own, all of us. Get a little *me time* for reflection. This country is too big, too unique, and way, way, too opinionated. Especially when you consider how uninformed much of its population is on things like facts and science, choosing instead to act on feelings and self-determined moral high ground.

In a perfect world—in a perfect America—I'd suggest that we ought to stay together (for the kids) but we've proven that we just can't get past our differences and have little interest in respectfully listening to each other and finding common ground. Plus, when you consider the state of healthcare and education in this country, it's pretty apparent that we don't give one huff about the kids.

And since we don't care about our future, let's call it quits now before someone else comes in and breaks us up at our weakest moment, like China or Russia or Canada. Best that we do it on our own terms.

So please, will someone just secede already?

Of course, my first response is "you first." If we're going to have another civil war, I think I'd like to be the Union this time. But, I'm not sure there's going to be a civil war. Or rather, that we've already had one, and the left lost.

Don't feel bad. My side lost too. But that's because neither of us represent the mainstream of America, and they won. They did so by electing Trump.

While there is far too much uncivil behavior and positions seem frozen at opposite sides of the political spectrum, the truth is that America agrees far more than it disagrees. Trump is a good example of that. He didn't win the popular vote, but he never needed to, and he won the electoral college quite handily. Trump is more unpopular than popular, but his views (or views close to them) represent not just nearly half of the country, but an overwhelming majority of it.

If there is a civil war in this country, the vast majority will try to avoid having anything to do with it. The fringe on left and right might be at each other's throats, but there's a vast middle that can and will get along.
